Ordinance Number 1994-4

An ordinance regulating the keeping of animals, livestock, and fowl in the City of Eden.

Sec 3-21 - All dogs and cats, harbored or maintained by their owners within the City of Eden shall be registered

Sec 3-25 - It shall be unlawful for any person to permit any dog or cat owned or kept by him to run at large within the City of Eden.

Sec 3-41- Upon being presented a sworn affidavit that a dog or a cat has bitten or scratched a person, the animal control officer shall quarantine the dog or cat so identified for a period of ten (10) days.

Sec 3-51 - No person shall keep livestock or poultry within the city limits of the City of Eden, Texas, without first obtaining and thereafter keeping in force a permit allowing him to do so. Livestock or poultry shall be kept within structures or enclosures and not permitted to run at large.

Sec 3-61 - It shall be unlawful for any person to keep or maintain within any zone in the city any wild and /or dangerous animal as defined above unless a special annual permit is first obtained from the city council.

Sec 3-65 Limit on number of wild and/or dangerous animals. In no event shall a permit be issued for the keeping of more than two (2) wild and /or dangerous animals at any single location.

Ordinance Number 2008-1

An ordinance pertaining to junked vehicles.

An ordinance adopting procedures for the abatement and removal from private or public property or a public right-of-way within the City of Eden, Texas, or its extraterritorial jurisdiction of any junked vehicle or part of a junked vehicle as a public nuisance and providing for penalties for violation of this ordinance.

Ordinance Number 1987-7

Garbage and Trash Ordinance



Sec 3 - Persons required keeping containers.

Every owner, agent, lessee tenant or occupant of any house, building, flat, apartment or tenement in the City of Eden, where persons reside, board, or lodge or where animal or vegetable food is prepared or served, shall provide such house, building, flat, apartment or tenement, and at all times maintain in good order and repair, a garbage or refuse container or containers for the deposit of garbage and refuse for collection.

Trash Accumulation

Sec 7 - (a) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to place, deposit or throw, or permit or cause to be placed, deposited or thrown, any garbage, bush, loose waste or refuse of any kind, on public or private property outside of any house, building, flat or tenement in the City of Eden,

(b) The following acts, among, others, are declared to be unlawful and in violation of this section, and subject to the penalties as provided by this ordinance, but such enumeration shall not be deemed to be exclusive.

(1) The throwing, placing dumping or depositing of any lawn trimmings, hedge trimmings, or any other cuttings or trimmings of weeds, flowers or other vegetation, garbage refuse, animal or vegetable waste matter of any kind on lots, vacant or occupied, driveways, or any other private property, or in any gutter, street, sidewalk, parkway, driveway, curb, alley or any other public property of the City of Eden.

Juvenile Curfew Ordinance 2008-2

An Ordinance of the City of Eden, Texas regarding curfew hours for minors; defining terms; creating offenses for minors, parents and guardians of minors, and business establishments violating curfew regulations; providing affirmative defenses; providing for penalties and waiver by the municipal court of jurisdiction over a minor when required under the Texas family code; providing for review of this ordinance within three years after the date of initial adoption and every third year thereafter; providing a repealer clause; providing a severability clause; and providing an effective date.

Curfew Hours for Minors

Curfew Hours means:

- (a) 11:00 p.m. on any Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday until 6:00 a.m. of the following day;
- (b) 12:01 a.m. until 6:00 a.m. on any Saturday or Sunday; and
- (c) 9:00 a.m. until 2:30 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday or Friday.

GREEN ROLL-OUT CONTAINERS – DO’S AND DON’TS

DO Put your green roll-out containers out early. They start at 7:00 am. Leave it out until the truck services it. We do have break down and end up late some days. Normally, if your container was not emptied, it was not out at the curb, something jammed inside, or the container was obstructed by a vehicle or it was not

positioned correctly (have the handle towards the house).

DO Keep the green roll-out containers off the curb on non-collecting days. You will be protecting the container and helping the appearance of the neighborhood. Containers do blow around in high wind and heavy rains cause them to float away.

DO Make sure coals from your fireplace or barbecue are cold. The containers will melt and burn so be very careful.

DO Bag loose paper it will trash your neighborhood. It can blow easily. Emptying containers in this West Texas wind can produce some spilling. “Bagged trash stops litter.”

DO Place the container close to the curb or in the curb so our truck can reach it. Have the handle towards the house.

Don’t Jam items into the container. A box stuffed in at the top or a piece of wood stuck in the container can keep the container from emptying. When the fingers grab the container, it is slightly squeezed and that is when “sticking” occurs.

Don’t Utilize both sides for collection. They only collect from the right side of the truck.

Don’t Overload your container. Cement blocks, rocks, dirt, or other construction debris are not to be placed in the container.
